Mr. Gagne, the CEO of Primex, the New Hampshire Public Risk Management Exchange, will discuss risk management practices that can be used both in the backcountry and more urban environments. 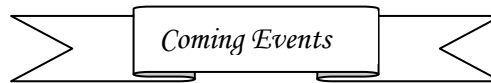
**Thursday, August 18**

Ascent via Notch Trail, then south on Mahoosuc Trail (Appalachian Trail) over Fulling Mill Mtn. and the three peaks of Goose Eye; descent via Goose Eye Trail. In the middle portion of this route, along the AT, there are small rocky summits, scrubby open ridges and two box ravines. Total 10 miles, 2260' vertical gain. Meet at Randolph East at 8 a.m. We will drive about ten miles on Success Pond Road (unpaved) to reach the trailhead. Children and dogs must be accompanied by adults who are responsible for them.
