

THE RANDOLPH FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

Since 1963, the Randolph Foundation has awarded scholarships to eligible Randolph residents to pursue their studies at the post-secondary level. The following questions and responses describe this program for all Randolph residents:

Who is eligible for a scholarship?

Any legal resident of Randolph for two (2) years or more who remains so at the time of the application. If the applicant is a high school senior, the student must also have resided as a resident of Randolph for two (2) years prior to graduation. For the renewal process, the student must continue to be a legal resident of Randolph and/or a dependent of his/her parent/guardian.

What kinds of courses are recognized by the Foundation for scholarship assistance?

Any courses at an accredited institution that provides undergraduate and/or graduate degrees.

What is the amount of a scholarship?

Undergraduate students receive a base scholarship of \$1700 annually (\$850 per semester) for a full-time course of undergraduate study not to exceed four (4) years.

Beginning at the second term of the first year of study, an undergraduate whose G.P.A. (grade point average) is 3.2 or higher for that semester will receive \$1000 to be used for the following semester. An undergraduate with a GPA less than 3.2 will receive \$850 for the following semester.

Graduate students receive a flat scholarship of \$1500 annually for a full-time course of graduate study not to exceed three (3) years.

What about part-time studies?

A part-time student is one who is enrolled in a full-time program of studies but is not taking a full complement of courses, thus extending the time for the completion of the program. Part-time study scholarships are based on full-time academic work. Scholarship payments for part-time registration will be prorated as a percentage of a full-time load.

How are scholarship payments made?

The Foundation Treasurer makes payments by check directly to the student, after receiving a completed application and supporting documentation each semester of enrollment. The first semester's scholarship will be mailed to the student's home address in August. The second semester's scholarship will be mailed to the student's home address in January.

How may I apply for a scholarship?

How are the initial and subsequent renewals handled?

The student must:

- maintain a year-round resident status in Randolph;
- submit an application for each semester the applicant is applying for scholarship assistance;
- include the tuition bill and grade report from the school of study (tuition bill must include name of institution, address of student, and student's name. Tuition bills from the internet are acceptable if they meet the above criteria. Grade reports from the internet with the student's name and semester are acceptable.)
- maintain a cumulative grade point average of 2.000 or above on a scale of 4.000, except for one term during the student's time in college in which the student's cum G.P.A. may fall to 1.667. Graduate students must show continued enrollment in good standing.
- be responsible for ensuring that the Foundation receives an application by August 1 and January 15 (If the deadline for the application cannot be met, a letter from the student explaining why the application was late must accompany the application.)
