Important Road and Parking Information: there will be a great deal of activity at the Ravine House Site area over the entire weekend. For logistical purposes and for the safety of all, please follow these critical directions:

- Carpool with others, if you can, because parking will be limited. Biking is encouraged!
- Parking is permitted along Durand Road east or west of the Ravine House lawn, and at Town Hall
- For both the Friday and Saturday night dinners, Linda Dupont has offered to drive along Durand Road and help shuttle people to the Ravine House lawn. Look for a silver Honda CRV with a "SHUTTLE" sign on it!
- Do not park in front of the Ravine House lawn on either side of the road at any time (day and night) as those areas will be used for catering, staging, deliveries, and other operations
- On Saturday, the east end of Durand Road all the way to the Ravine House lawn will be closed to traffic from 10:30 am noon for the parade. To watch the parade, please park on the Durand access road, at Town Hall, or on Durand Road west of the Ravine House lawn.
